**The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) is dedicated to keeping our capital city safe. As a Police Community Support Officer (PCSO), you'll work in the heart of London's communities. That's alongside police officer colleagues and the people who call London home, to solve problems, reduce crime and tackle anti-social behaviour together.**

You'll build connections, be a visible policing presence and through strong, trusted relationships build a picture of what's going on in your area to make neighbourhoods safer. Every day is different and you'll work day and evening shifts.

We offer all the training you'll need to do the job well. Over six weeks you'll gain the skills and knowledge to enable you to serve your community with confidence. You'll learn about topics including community policing, gathering intelligence, public and personal safety, first aid, communication skills and problem solving

Delivered at a Met training establishment your classroom based training will run from Monday to Friday. Training will follow a shift pattern on alternate weeks – early: 7am–3pm; day: 9am–5pm; late: 2pm–10pm.

We offer a competitive starting salary of £30,232 per annum, including allowances.

To join as a PCSO, you'll need to meet our eligibility criteria, and:

- Be 17 or older, you can start your role with us when you turn 18.
- GCSE Grade c/4 or above (or equivalent) in English Language. If you don't hold this you can sit a written test as part of your assessment day.
